Regarding class style after June 1 (Tuesday)

On May 25, we have decided the activity guideline phase and the class style from June 1 at “The 29th Novel Coronavirus Emergency Response Headquarters Meeting” as follows:

1. Based on the activity guideline, the phase will continue to be “IV” from June 1

Assuming that the state of emergency in Osaka, Kyoto, and Hyogo will be extended, Tenri University’s activity guideline will be “Phase IV” while the state of emergency in the three prefectures is issued.

The infection situation has settled down to a certain extent in Nara Prefecture, and the outbreak of infected people has subsided in Tenri City and our University. Therefore, face-to-face classes will be flexibly introduced for seminar-type classes and practicum subjects.

Currently, classes are conducted on an online basis at Tenri University. However, it is not limited to on-demand classes. Therefore, the University will provide the following facilities for students who attend face-to-face classes on campus so that they can take real-time online classes on campus:

◇Somanouchi Campus:

Student Hall, Computer Lab, Information Library Main Building 2nd Floor, Classrooms

◇Taiikugakubu Campus:

Computer Lab, Student Hall, Classrooms

The above-mentioned facilities can be used at each campus.
