[Important Notice] Regarding class style after September 1 (Wednesday)

Tenri University Novel Coronavirus Emergency Response Headquarters Director-general (President) Noriaki Nagao

On August 31, we have decided the following at the 32nd Novel Coronavirus Emergency Response Headquarters Meeting:

1. Based on the activity guideline, the phase will become "IV" from September 1

Comprehensively judging the current infection status in Nara, Osaka, and Kyoto prefectures, Tenri University's activity guideline will be "Phase IV" from September 1 (Wednesday).

As a result, classes for the fall semester starting from September 16 (Thursday) will be conducted on an online basis at Tenri University. As for Seminar-style classes, some classes may be held face-to-face, but in principle, all classes will be conducted online.

In the future, if the infection status changes, we will notify you promptly.

2. There will be limits to the usage time of on-campus facilities, and other restrictions

Students, faculty, and staff are requested to fill out the health checklist and behavior record chart.

The open hours for the Information Library and Computer Lab will be shortened. Those using the joint laboratories are requested to be extra careful about following the safety measures.

In principle, school affairs business trips such as solicitations are prohibited. If the business trip is absolutely necessary, permission must be obtained from the head of

the traveler's Department.

3. Please refrain from going out unnecessarily, refrain from social gatherings and so-called drinking parties, and try to keep quiet when eating to reduce the risk of infection as much as possible

The number of infected people is increasing explosively in neighboring prefectures, and the government has issued a "state of emergency." In Nara Prefecture, the number of infected people continues to be confirmed at extremely high levels, and many are believed to be infected with the Delta strain, which is not only extremely infectious but also has a high risk of hospitalization. In order to overcome the current crisis, it is necessary for each to take infection control measures seriously and break the chain of infection.

In Nara Prefecture, we are implementing "emergency countermeasures" (as of August 31) in order to control the spread of infection with a strong sense of crisis and to promote efforts to save lives with all our might. Please thoroughly implement the infection control measures listed on the Nara Prefecture website.
