## Regarding class format after January 27 (Thursday)

On January 18, we have decided the following at] the 37<sup>th</sup> Novel Coronavirus Emergency Response Headquarters Meeting

### 1. Based on the activity guideline, the phase will be “III” from **January 27**

Comprehensively judging the current infection status in Nara, Osaka, and Kyoto prefectures, the activity guideline of our University will be “Phase III” from **January 27 (Thursday)**.

However, please note that there is a rapid spread of infection since the new year has begun, so depending on the subject, the instructor in charge may contact you regarding the change in class format.

In addition, the fall semester final examination from **January 27**—when Phase III will be enforced—will be conducted upon taking measures to prevent the spread of infection, but the examination implementation method may change depending on the class subject. Please check for notifications from instructors in charge of your class, as well as from the University.

※In the future, if the infection status changes, we will notify you promptly.

### 2. There will be limits to the usage time of on-campus facilities, and other restrictions

Students, faculty, and staff are requested to fill out the health checklist

and behavior record chart.

The open hours for the Information Library and Computer Lab will be shortened. Those using the joint laboratories are requested to be extra careful about following the safety measures.

In principle, school affairs business trips such as solicitations are prohibited. If the business trip is absolutely necessary, permission must be obtained from the head of the Traveler's Department.
