We have decided the following at the 40th Novel Coronavirus Emergency Response Headquarters Meeting:

1. Regarding the lowering of the phase of the activity guideline

Comprehensively judging the current infection status in Nara Prefecture and the neighboring prefectures, Tenri University will set the activity guideline phase to "II" from April 1 (Friday).

As a result, classes from April 7 (Thursday) will be face-to-face for classes with 100 or less students.

At the same time, Tenri University has revised a part of the activity guideline. The revised parts are shown in red in the chart below

2. Regarding the "Request for Class Consideration"

The online class attendance system based on the notification of the "Request for Class Consideration," which was implemented until last year, will not be implemented in the 2022-2023 school year.

3. Regarding limits to the usage time of on-campus facilities, and other restrictions
